
## 2011-2012 INSTALLATION SERVICE



This coming year we will seek God's direction as we live in the world. *Show Me Your Ways, O Lord*.... that is what we will be asking of God as we gather in our local groups, in regional meetings, during retreats, and as we give to the projects we've voted on this week. *Show Me Your Ways, O Lord* ... and as the Women's Ministry Executive Committee (regional officers/local officers/etc) you will be asking it on behalf of the women with whom you will work and serve alongside in the coming year.

Our guiding scripture is Psalm 25: 4-5. That whole psalm was written as an acrostic poem with each line beginning with a letter from the Hebrew alphabet. That's a pretty clever and effective teaching method. So, for this installation service we will consider your duties as officers in the form of an acrostic poem using the word "OFFICERS".

First of all, as an officer you need to be **OPEN** – open to God's Spirit for direction and wisdom; open to each other for new ideas and new ways of doing Women's Ministry, open to the women you will be shepherding in the coming year.

You will also need to be **FAITHFUL** – to your duties as an officer and to each other. When you accept a task, you will need to be faithful to follow through and follow up. You will also especially need to be faithful to your own personal spiritual walk knowing that it will be a challenge to lead others in the way, if you are struggling to find your own way.

As an officer, it will be important for you to be **FRIENDLY**. That sound trite and childish, but until folks know that you care about them, they won't really care about what you know. As Women's Ministry officers, take the time to get to know folks and build caring relationships with your regional officers and those with whom you will be working in the coming year.

It will also be helpful for you to be **INNOVATIVE** as an officer. We live in a changing world and Women's Ministry will need innovative leadership on all levels in order to thrive in the future. Don't be afraid to try something new, especially after prayer and listening to God for direction. Accept the challenge of walking a new path, of discovering new ways of doing Women's Ministry, of being innovative!

Be **COMPASSIONATE**. As you serve in the coming year there will be many occasions where you will need to listen with a compassionate and tender heart. You will be called upon to pray for women; women and situations you will not know anything about, but you can lift them up to the One who knows everything. Be ready to love and listen with your heart open.

You will definitely need a lot of energy in the coming, so be **ENERGETIC!** If it takes a good 8-10 hours of sleep, a gallon of high-caffeine coffee or diet Coke; a morning run or daily yoga - whatever it takes, be prepared to serve in the coming year with high energy and enthusiasm.

As an officer you will need to be **RESOURCEFUL** – you will be called upon to give insight and direction in a multitude of situations. Know the resources that are available in the Resource Manual, the website and within the denomination. Know whom to call upon if you can't answer a particular question. Be sure to follow through when someone comes to you for help and guidance.

And lastly, be prepared to be a **SERVANT** leader. Following in the example of Jesus when he knelt down to wash his disciple's feet be prepared to do a similar work in the coming year. Wash feet. Love and serve others.
