Theme Introduction – Show Your Ways, O Lord Presented by Mary Ann Cole, Convention President

My granddaddy taught me signs to look for to find my way when I was lost:

- Moss on the North side of the tree; but I'm not always in the woods
- Follow the North Star; what if is in the day time!
- Sun rises in the East; Sun sets in the West-and this does me a lot of good at night or if it's cloudy!

Anyway we need to purchase a ticket. And finally you must pack what you will need while you are away.

Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life, no man comes to the Father but by me." (John 14:6) He is the only way to heaven and <u>only</u> He can purchase the ticket. We cannot afford it, no matter how much money, power, or influence we have, no matter how many good works we may have done.
